### Financial Reality Fair 2025 @ Portage High School

On Thursday, October 9th, the Johnstown Chapter of Credit Unions hosted a Financial Reality Fair for 11th and 12th grade students at Portage High School. The Financial Reality Fair is designed to place students in real-life situations where they select a career, provided with an entry level salary and challenged to make decisions while remaining within budget. Students visited booths to purchase housing, clothing, food and transportation. Non-essential options were presented, such as entertainment, internet and cell phones. Students spun the "reality wheel" and met with financial counselors from area Credit Unions to review their decisions.

"It was crazy to see how quickly everything added up. Then the wheel of reality...how am I going to pay for a car repair or a broken cell phone?" says Portage student. "We loved the idea of helping students navigate real-life budgeting scenarios and plan for life events as part of the financial cycle. It was a fun and meaningful way to connect with youth and support financial literacy," mentions Greg Sisitki, Chapter President.

118 Industrial Park Road set to open in December 2025



We have come a long way from an empty lot to what will be our new location in Ebensburg. From moving the first load of dirt and debris to seeing the actual building taking shape has been exciting for the entire team here at USSCO.



At the end of October, all of the structure has been completed and the flooring has been installed. In early November, the teller line casework and bathrooms will be completed. Soon after, we will see the parking lot being paved and final paint inside. By the end of November the project should be 85% to 90% completed with some interior items and last minute details to finish. A couple of outside projects will also begin, fencing and sign work.



We are all very excited to see the finished product. Thank you to PW Campbell and all of the contractors that have tirelessly worked on the building.

'Tis the season to be jolly! Not all about the holiday season is all happy and nice.

- I.Online Shopping Scam: A shopper visits a bogus site that appears to belong to a popular retailer and purchases an item that does not exist. The shopper will never receive the item, nor be able to reclaim lost funds. <a href="Protect:">Protect:</a> Only shop reputable websites. Check URL of each site you visit to ensure you are on a trusted site.
- Charity Scam: A charity targets dogooders, asking for donations.
   Unfortunately, the charity is bogus, and the money will go right into the hands of scammers.

<u>Protect:</u> donating money to a charity, seek them out yourself instead of following a link or ad. Verify charities via Charity Navigator, or CharityWatch.

- 3.**Gift Card Scam:** Fraudsters convince victims to share their gift card codes by pretending to be tech support or another believable contact.

  Protect: Never share sensitive info with an unverified contact.
- 4.**Porch Pirate:** Thieves stake out residences and snatch packages off porches. Scammers may follow delivery trucks. Once off, there's no way to recover the packages.

  <u>Protect:</u> Track packages, once notified an item has been delivered...bring it inside.
- **5. Travel Scam:** Fraudsters offer vacation packages at rock-bottom prices. Then, disappear once paid. <a href="Protect: Research any agency you're using and be wary of sites/ads with poor grammar and/or poor spelling.">Protect: Research any agency you're using and be wary of sites/ads with poor grammar and/or poor spelling.</a>
- **6.Romance Scam:** A love interest will build a relationship, then ask for funds. <u>Protect:</u> Be wary of quick relationships. Never send money to unverified contacts.

Don't let scammers be the grinch this Christmas. Stay safe!
